From this foundation of love and after consulting with the church council I am announcing the suspension of all public activities at Fish Lake **Lutheran Church until April** 1st and possibly longer. This includes Sunday worship, Wednesday Lenten worship, children and youth activities, WELCA and committee meetings.

We do this for several reasons. First and foremost, we do this out of love of our **neighbor**. The virus is evident in our community and is contagious even before one has recognizable symptoms. Anyone of us might be carrying the virus and not know it. We each need to do whatever we can to slow down the epidemic and suspending all activity is one way. vulnerable population is the elderly, which are many of our members.

We also do this out of respect to our governing authorities. Churches across the country are taking these steps at the recommendation of the Center of Disease Control (CDC). Our president, governor and other civic leaders have taken these drastic measures to ensure the safety of all our citizens.

But we do not <u>act</u> out of fear. I recognize that fear is very real in this situation. Our world has entered uncharted territory and we do not know all the outcomes from the pandemic. The fear has caused panic in the supermarket and the stock market. I have felt those moments of fear as I play with my grandkids and as I celebrated my daughter's wedding this past week-end.

Yet God remains the constant

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God and God abides in them. . . There is no fear in love, but perfect love cast out fear. (I John 4:16,18). All of us will have feelings of fear, but we can chose how we respond to our fears. I invite you to act from our core love of God and neighbor and not fear. 

What is so GOOD about Good Friday?

Two of the most holy days of the church year are Good Friday and Easter Sunday, remembering Jesus' death and resurrection.

Growing up I struggled to understand what was GOOD about Good Friday. After all, Jesus' crucifixion was a horrible way to die. The mocking, whipping and nailing were intense forms of suffering that never seemed GOOD from my perspective. Why would God put his beloved son through such pain? My pastor described his death as a transaction, a payment, in which Jesus paid the price for my sin. Someone had to pay the cost. But my mind wasn't satisfied and I would ask another question: who is Jesus paying off? Who needs this ransom, the blood money? Does God NEED the death of his only son in order to forgive us? If God is so loving, why would God demand the crucifixion of his only Son to forgive

That question haunted me until later in life, when it slowly dawned on me through my reading and prayerful reflection that it was not God who demanded Jesus' death, but human beings. We placed Jesus on the cross, because humanity could not control or direct God's love as demonstrated to us in Jesus. The religious leaders and government officials decided on Good Friday to crucified Jesus; the crowd shouted "Crucify him." We are the guilty party, not God.

Someone might say, "But I wasn't there 2,000 years ago. I didn't do that." Yet we are guilty in other ways. Jesus, in one of last parables, says, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." When we refuse to love our neighbor as ourselves, we add to Jesus suffering on the cross.

Still does my guilt make Good Friday GOOD? Not by itself. What makes Good Friday GOOD is how God responds to our atrocious act. Though we killed God's son, God shows us the depth of God's love by forgiving us, raising Jesus from the dead and promising to raise us up as well. Good Friday becomes the path we follow into the joy and love of God, shown to us in Easter's Resurrection. God shows God's love for us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)

Furthermore, Jesus demonstrates that suffering and death can lead to life. We can look at the suffering we experience in this life not as a danger to be avoided at all costs, but rather as a path that can transform us into the image of God. As St Paul writes in Romans 5:3-5, Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.



So I'll share some thoughts. There are those who will not handle social distancing very well. If you are one of them, let others know that you want/need them. Also, we can all be more intentional about reaching out to one another - phone calls, emails, even cards in the mail will help. With today's technology, we are able to stay in touch with family and friends so easily.

Also, know that you can request financial help through the Shalom Fund at church. This is money we receive from the Shalom Shop in Cambridge because we have had volunteers work there every Monday. If you are in a bind, please contact the office or you can even reach out to me personally and I will consult with the pastor and/or treasurer. Your request is confidential.

Jesus instructs us to set our hearts on God's kingdom. But how does one do this when there are so many things to worry about? Here are words from Henri Nouwen in his book *Here and Now*. One way is to move from the mind to the heart by slowly saying a prayer with as much attentiveness as possible. A prayer, prayed from the heart, heals. Start with the Our

Father, the Creed, a favorite verse from a Psalm. As you go through the day let the words of one of these prayers go through your mind simply trying to listen with your whole being. You will be distracted by your worries, but keep going back to the words of the prayer and you will gradually discover your worries become less obsessive and that you are enjoying prayer.

I use the phrase called The Jesus Prayer, to repeat throughout the day, "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." It has become a phrase that comes from my heart and calms my mind. It is an easy practice and one that can have benefits now and in the future.
